

ORDINANCE 15-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ALACHUA, FLORIDA; AMENDING SECTION 38-170 RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC SERVICE, SECTION 38-171 NON-RESIDENTIAL DEMAND SERVICE AND SECTION 38-172 NON-RESIDENTIAL, NON-DEMAND SERVICE; INCREASING THE BASE RATES FOR RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC SERVICE, GENERAL SERVICE DEMAND, GENERAL SERVICE LARGE DEMAND AND GENERAL SERVICE NON-DEMAND; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Alachua provides electric services to residential and non-residential customers located within its electric service territory; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alachua Commission has established rates and charges for electric services; and

WHEREAS, the electric rates and charges require amendment from time to time in order to ensure prudent management of public assets; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alachua Commission hereby amends Section 38-170, Section 38-171 and Section 38-172 of the City of Alachua Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALACHUA, FLORIDA.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF SECTION 38-170.

Section 38-170 - Residential Electric Service is hereby amended as set forth below.

- (a) Base rate. The rate to be charged and collected for electric energy furnished by the City to consumers for residential service shall be a customer service charge

Customer Charge:	\$9.00	\$9.14 per Month
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- (b) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge for the first 1,000 kilowatt hours of energy consumed

1 st - 1,000 kWh	\$0.0920	\$0.0934 per kWh
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- (c) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge in excess of 1,000 kilowatt hours of energy consumed

Above-1,000 kWh	\$0.1020	\$0.1036 per kWh
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- (d) Taxes. An amount equal to all applicable taxes imposed against the sale or consumption of electric energy shall be added to the rates hereinabove set forth. The United States of America, the State and all political subdivisions, agencies, boards, commissions and instrumentalities thereof and all recognized churches are exempt from the City's utility tax.

- (e) Availability. This service is available to consumers both within and outside the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF SECTION 38-171.

Section 38-171 – Non-Residential Demand Service is hereby amended as set forth below.

- (a) Base rate for general service demand. The rate to be charged and collected for electric energy furnished by the City for non-residential demand service shall be a customer service charge

Customer Charge	\$45.00	\$45.71 per Month
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- (b) Plus a kilowatt demand charge per month consumption for energy consumed

Demand Charge	\$7.25	\$7.36 per kW
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- (c) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge for energy consumed

Energy Charge	\$0.0690	\$0.0701 per kWh
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- (d) Base rate for general service large demand. The rate to be charged and collected for electric energy furnished by the City for non-residential large demand service shall be a customer service charge

Customer Charge	\$45.00	\$45.71 per Month
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- (e) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge for energy consumed

Demand Charge	\$7.25—	\$7.36 per kW
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- (f) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge for energy consumed

Energy Charge	\$0.0660	\$0.0670 per kWh
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- (g) Taxes. An amount equal to all applicable taxes imposed against the sale or consumption of electric energy shall be added to the rates hereinabove set forth. The United States of America, the State and all political subdivisions, agencies, boards, commissions and instrumentalities thereof and all recognized churches are exempt from the City's utility tax.
- (h) Availability. This service is available to consumers both within and outside the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT OF SECTION 38-172.

Section 38-172 – Non-Residential Non-Demand Service is hereby amended as set forth below.

- (a) Base rate. The rate to be charged and collect for electric energy furnished by the City to consumers for general service non-demand service shall be a customer service charge

Customer Charge	\$11.50	\$11.68 per Month
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- (b) Plus a kilowatt hour per month consumption charge for energy consumed

Energy Charge	\$0.0970	\$0.0985 per kWh
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- (c) Taxes. An amount equal to all applicable taxes imposed against the sale or consumption of electric energy shall be added to the rates hereinabove set forth. The United States of America, the State and all political subdivisions, agencies, boards, commissions and instrumentalities thereof and all recognized churches are exempt from the City's utility tax.

- (d) Availability. This service is available to consumers both within and outside the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 4. REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT.

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

It is the declared intent of the Alachua City Commission that, if any section, sentence, clause, phrase or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by a court or agency of competent jurisdiction, such holding of invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance and the remainder of this ordinance, after the exclusion of such part or parts, shall continue to be valid.

SECTION 6. INCLUSION IN THE CODE.

It is the intention of the City of Alachua Commission, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made part of the City of Alachua Code of Ordinances; that the Code may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish this intention.

SECTION 7. PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall be effective on October 15, 2015.

PASSED on first reading on the **27th day of July, 2015.**
