Problem Identification

The City of Alachua continues to experience economic growth and development - with this also comes an increase in the crime rate. Crime, in and of itself is also evolving; specifically, in the realm of technology. Smart phones, social media, applications and text messaging contain a wealth of knowledge and information that law enforcement may use to combat criminal activity. The Alachua Police Department does not have equipment necessary to extract information from these types of mobile devices and/or applications, and must rely on the resources of other law enforcement agencies for assistance.

With increasing case loads, the Alachua Police Department needs access to this technology without reliance on other agencies. Having this resource available in-house would permit utilization with a variety of cases, as opposed to only those considered high profile. This technology will enhance the department's criminal investigations division, and provide for a means to access information on mobile devices by bypassing user locks, recovering application data and revealing deleted data, etc.

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

The ultimate goal of this project is to purchase requested equipment with grant funds to enhance the criminal investigations division of the Alachua Police Department; in turn, providing for more efficient and effective investigative services to the citizens of Alachua. The department proposes to purchase a Universal Forensic Extraction Device (UFED) and cloud analyzer.

This technology will be used by agency investigators to access and extract information from a variety of mobile electronic devices. Investigators will then have access to a myriad of information, such as - call data, text and picture messages, emails, calendar events, contact files; location information decoded from device applications, GPS, cell towers Wi-Fi networks and media files, to name a few. In short, access to this information may lead to critical evidence that will aid in the arrest and prosecution of suspects under criminal investigation by the Alachua Police Department.
