


NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD OF THE CITY OF ALACHUA, FLORIDA

Notice is hereby given that the Planning & Zoning Board of the City of Alachua will hold a public hearing on July 12, 2016 at 6:30 PM. The hearing will be held in the James A. Lewis Commission Chambers in City Hall, located at 15100 NW 142nd Terrace, Alachua, Florida, to consider the following: a request by Ryan Thompson, AICP, of CHW, Inc., agent for 10.47, LLC and Wyndswept Hills, LLC, property owners, for the consideration of a Small Scale Comprehensive Plan Amendment (SSCPA) to the City of Alachua Future Land Use Map (FLUM) from Community Commercial to High Density Residential (±1.8 acres) and from High Density Residential to Community Commercial (±3.87) on an approximate 5.67 acre subject property, located north of One 51 Place Apartments and Wyndswept Hills Subdivision, south of Park Vegetariana, west of the Alachua Professional Plaza, and near the western terminus of NW 151 Boulevard, consisting of Tax Parcel No. 03869-006-000, and portions of Nos. 03869-007-000 & 03869-009-000. Existing FLUM: High Density Residential and Community Commercial; Zoning: PD-COMM.



At the public hearing, all interested parties may appear and be heard with respect to the application. Copies of the application are available for public inspection at the Planning and Community Development Department, 15100 NW 142nd Terrace, Alachua, Florida, on any regular business day between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Written comments on the application may be sent to the following address: City of Alachua, Planning and Community Development, P.O. Notice is given pursuant to Section 286.0105, Florida Statutes, that, in order to appeal any decision made at the public hearing, you will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, you may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. Yellowfin sues rival startup

Bradenton company accuses new boatmaker Barker of copying hull design

From their 17-foot skiff to their 42-foot offshore, few vessels are as distinctive as the open fisherman-style, center-console boats from Yellowfin.

The Bradenton-based firm has been in business for 14 years, and has sold more than 1,000 vessels.

Yellowfin's boats feature a uniquely shaped hull and sheer line - which they claim is a "distinctive appearance that creates an overall commercial impression that boaters have come to know and appreciate."

In legal terms, the look and feel of a product especially when it's immediately recognizable by the public as a specific brand - is described as its "trade dress."

A product's trade dress is protected at the federal level by the Lanham Act, the primary trademark statute in the United States.

Now, Yellowfin is suing a competitor, Barker Boatworks, which was founded in 2014 by Kevin Barker, a former Yellowfin vice president. So far, Barker Boatworks has delivered 20 boats and has orders for 50 more.

Yellowfin is alleging that Barker violated its trade dress rights by making boats that are states. very similar in design to theirs. Yellowfin also has accused Barker of stealing trade secrets from the company where he worked for four years, have denied.

Citing the litigation, Barker and Nagler declined to comment for this story.

Attorneys for Yellowfin first sent a cease-anddesist letter to Barker in October 2014.

"It has come to our client's attention that after you left Yellowfin, you set up a competing company, Barker Boatworks, LLC, and have promoted and marketed the manufacturing of a line of boats that infringes Yellowfin's trade dress rights," the letter states. "As you know, Yellowfin has been manufacturing a line of boats for approximately 14 years that have a distinct appearance that creates an overall commercial impression that boaters have come to know and appreciate."

Attorneys for Barker asked if Yellowfin had conducted consumer surveys to gauge whether Barker's alleged infringement on Yellowfin's trade dress was noticeable to the public.


In April 2015, Yellowfin responded by filing suit.

In their complaint, which alleges trade dress infringement, unfair competition and false information to circumdesignation of origin vent the work involved under the Lanham Act, in setting up a business, Yellowfin notes that the identifying key source company began designing a new hull in the late requirements contacts, 1990s.

"All of the models share a substantial part of the sheer line, and Yellowfin has expended significant resources, advertising and promoting its line of boats that incorporate this unique trade dress," the complaint states.

have "come to identify the distinctive features of the Yellowfin Trade Dress as identifying the manufacturer of the Yellowfin boats, to wit, Yellowfin."

Barker, court documents claim, launched Barker Boatworks in 2014, and posted a design on his Facebook site of a 25-foot open fisherman-style boat called the "Calibogue Bay," which Yellowfin alleged violated their trade dress rights because of its similar design.

Barker Boatworks exhibited their first production model at boat shows in Miami Beach and Palm Beach in February and April 2015.

"A comparison of line drawings of the two boats and the finished boats makes it difficult to know which one is manufactured by Yellowfin and which one is by Defendants," the complaint

In addition to treble damages and attorney's fees, Yellowfin is asking the court to block Barker Boatworks from infringing on their trade dress allegations his attorneys rights, and to force the defendants to recall and "surrender for destruction all products, order Yellowfin owner Wylie forms, price lists, labels, advertisements, brochures, catalogs, packaging materials and other materials incorporating or imitating Plaintiff's trade dress."

Trade secrets

Yellowfin has asked the court to order Barker Boatworks managers to turn over their cellphones and computers for inspection, because they allege that Barker stole trade secrets before leaving the company.

"As a Vice President, he had access to sensitive company information, information that he knew Yellowfin did not share publicly and would not want shared with a competitor. Among that trade secret information were (1) detailed information about its 550+ customers, and (2) detailed information about Yellowfin's sources for components and materials used in the manufacture of its boats, including pricing," the complaint states. "A competitor obtaining that information could target Yellowfin's customers and could use the source companies, negotiating negotiating pricing for materials, etc."

When Barker left, Yellowfin began an internal audit of its computer

system. "As set forth in greater detail below, an initial review of some of the information from that laptop computer, together with other information learned by Yellowfin regarding Mr. Barker's activities during the days leading up to his 31, 2015, to add a claim against the Defendants for theft of trade secrets."

Barker's attorneys have denied the allegations.

"Red Bull has distinc-

tiveness - you don't even need to read the words on the can to know what it is," Pollard said. "The consumer makes an immediate connection."


The attorney said Yellowfin's suit appears to fall somewhat short in the area of creating customer confusion.

"There's a big difference between buying a can of Red Bull and purchasing an expensive boat," he said. "When you get into the real big-ticket luxury items like a boat selling for several hundred thousand dollars, no discerning consumer who has millions of dollars to spend would actually be confused between a Yellowfin and a Barker. Nobody buying a Barker boat is ever going to say, 'Damn. I thought it was a Yellowfin. I was confused.""

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


