# Trustees set stage for FAMU president's exit

TALLAHASSEE – Elmira Mangum will no longer lead the country's largest historically black public university if Florida A&M University trustees approve a plan advanced Wednesday to end her two-year presidency.

Under the terms of an agreement, endorsed by a special presidential leadership committee, Mangum would immediately step down and be replaced by an interim president if the full board of trustees approves the plan today.

The trustees earlier this year refused to extend Mangum's three-year contract, which expires in April, with some trustees describing communication problems between the president and the trustees and other university groups. Mangum is the first woman to serve as a non-interim president in FAMU's 129-year history.

At a board meeting in August, Mangum defended her presidency, citing achievements that led to the Legislature awarding \$25 million in performance funding to the school. But since that meeting, Mangum and her attorney have been in

an exit plan.

"We are looking to work with Dr. Mangum and to simply show our appreciation for her service and at the same time have a smooth transition," said Thomas Dortch, a trustee who chaired the presidential leadership committee that negotiated the deal.

Under the agreement, after Mangum immediately steps down, she would continue to earn her \$425,000 annual salary until April 1, when she would begin a 12-month sabbatical. By Oct. 2, 2017, she would have to notify the school about whether she would continue as a tenured professor at the university.

If she opts for the professorship, she would receive 90 percent of her base pay as president in her first year, with the salary being adjusted to the highest salary paid for any FAMU professor in subsequent years.

Mangum would have 30 days to leave the president's on-campus residence once she steps down, with \$7,500 in moving expenses.

The agreement would also reimburse Mangum for \$6,500 in legal fees.

Jaylen Smith, a trustee and president of the Student Government Association,

negotiations with trustees on opposed the agreement. saying students had not been represented when the special committee initially discussed the exit plan at a Sept. 2 meeting in Orlando.

"The students' voices were not being heard and they're still not being heard. Does my voice matter? That's the question," said Smith, who was unable to attend the Orlando meeting because of a flight delay.

Smith said he expects a group of FAMU students to protest Mangum's departure at the trustees' meeting today.

"I would definitely prefer to see the president get a fair chance," said Smith, who said his opinion echoed a large number of FAMU students.

The presidential leadership committee on Wednesday also voted to recommend a plan to move FAMU through the transition of Mangum's departure and the selection of the next president.

Under the proposal, the trustees would name an interim president today, initially offering a 90-day contract that could eventually be converted to a one-year contract, subject to approval by the state Board of Governors, which oversees the 12 Florida public universities.

# Challenge to state's gay-marriage law dismissed

RALEIGH, N.C. - A federal judge has dismissed a challenge to a North Carolina law that says magistrates with religious objections can refuse to marry same-sex couples.

The judge ruled the three couples who brought the case - two gay and one interracial – lacked legal standing to sue and lacked evidence showing they were harmed directly by the law that took effect in June 2015.

North Carolina and Utah are the only states currently enforcing such religious-recusal laws. About 5 percent of North Carolina's magistrates have filed recusal notices, which prevent them from officiating at all marriages gay and heterosexual – for at least six months. The

law also allows some court Tuesday. clerks to decline to issue marriage licenses because of "any sincerely held religious objection."

The plaintiffs argued they could sue because some taxpayer money was being used for travel expenses for other magistrates to come to McDowell County, where all the magistrates had recused themselves. But U.S. District Judge Max Cogburn wrote they didn't point to any specific funds appropriated by the legislature to implement the law's alleged unconstitutional purpose.

The couples who sued the state courts director also "lack standing by virtue of the fact that their claims are merely generalized grievances with a state law with which they disagree," Cogburn said in the decision released late

The couples' lawyers filed a notice Wednesday saying they'll appeal Tues day's ruling to the 4th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals. A married lesbian couple who sued and live in McDowell County told reporters last month they're worried whether they can get equal and fair treatment from local magistrates, knowing their recusals.

The law "expressly declares that magistrates' religious beliefs are superior to their oath of judicial office to uphold and support the federal constitution. And the law spends public money to advance those religious beliefs. That is a straightforward violation of the 1st Amendment," Luke Largess, a lawyer for the couples, said in a news release.

Cogburn wrote that it's

possible someone could suffer real harm because of the law, but he said the plaintiffs provided no evidence that has actually happened. The law says a chief District Court judge or county Register of Deeds both elected officials

 must ensure marriage transactions are carried out if no one else is available. Senate Leader Phil Berger, R-Rockingham, the chief sponsor of the

legislation, said the law

actually protects 1st

Amendment rights. "We appreciate the court recognizing the plaintiffs failed to identify even one North Carolinian who was denied the ability to get married under this reasonable law," Berger said in a release.

During oral arguments last month over the state's motion to dismiss the lawsuit, Cogburn pointed out that recusals can remain secret - particularly in counties where not all magistrates have objected. The state courts system considers recusal paper work part of personnel records.

"A law that allows a state official to opt out of performing some of the duties of the office for sincerely held religious beliefs, while keeping it a secret that the official opted out, is fraught with potential for harm that could be of constitutional magnitude," he wrote.

Cogburn, an appointee of President Barack Obama, was the first judge to formally strike down North Carolina's gay marriage ban in October 2014. The McDowell County couple were among plaintiffs in one of the lawsuits that successfully challenged that ban.

## Not so fast on full custody, experts say of Jolie's demand

LOS ANGELES - In the global hubbub over the Brangelina divorce, Angelina Jolie Pitt's demand for sole physical custody of her six children with Brad Pitt has attracted its share of the attention. Yet experts say Jolie Pitt won't have the final say, and that Pitt and the couple's eldest son, Maddox, may even have a voice in custody arrangements.

Stacy Phillips, a veteran divorce attorney, called Jolie Pitt's request for sole physical custody a "wish list," one that could change as the divorce progresses. Phillips, like many, saw the request as a message to Pitt, although what the actress is trying to convey won't be known for some time, if ever.

Pitt has yet to file his

legal response to Jolie to 15-year-old Maddox. Pitt's divorce petition, but each actor released statements Tuesday indicating their children were the priority. The pair has six children, ranging in ages from 8-year-old twins Knox and Vivienne

"It's not uncommon that a person would seek sole physical custody in their initial filing," said divorce lawyer Lori Howe. "That doesn't mean it is what they will end up seeking if they

resolve the case through settlement or in a courtroom. ... She very well could change her mind as well. And there's nothing to stop her from doing that, despite having checked those boxes on her petition."

California law favors joint custody of children, and judges can generally consider the opinion of children who are 14 years or older about which parent they want to live with.

Divorce lawyers, however, say the couple can avoid placing their children in the middle of a divorce if they work out an agreement in private.

"The parents should be parents, as opposed to letting the children be the parents," said Phillips, an attorney in the Los Angeles office of Blank Rome LLP. "They didn't ask for this. They need to be kept as children."

Attorney Steven Mindel said in some instances, a judge may want to know the opinion of children younger than 14-yearsold, but in general, courts encourage parents to work out the custody protracted legal fights.

"You generally don't want a child testifying against a parent," Mindel said. "It's emotionally draining on the child."

Testimony doesn't have to be in a courtroom. It can be solicited by an attorney appointed to represent the child's interests, or can be done in a judge's chambers, if

necessary, Mindel said. If the actors get into a public custody fight, a judge might appoint an attorney for each of the Jolie-Pitt family's children. "If you do it strictly by the book, each child should have separate representation," said Maya Shulman, a divorce attorney who specializes in resolving difficult custody cases.

In most instances, Phillips, Shulman and Mindel said, parents will work out the arrangements behind the scenes. Pitt Jolie and Pitt have an incentive to do that, the lawyers said, said. "There just couldn't because of their celebrity be any benefit to them or

Previous Hollywood breakups provide some insight into how quiet, and how ugly, custody fights can become.

Mel Gibson's divorce from his wife Robyn was quiet, with very few court hearings and very little attention after the actor's wife filed for divorce in April 2009. The pair has seven children, although only one was a minor when they divorces. It took nearly two-and-ahalf years - with Gibson's very public custody fight with ex-girlfriend Oksana Grigorieva playing out in the middle of it — for the Gibsons to finalize their divorce.

Similarly, Maria Shriver's divorce from Arnold Schwarzenegger has remained out of the public eye for years. After an initial flurry of filings in July 2011, no public hearings or documents have been filed in the case. Their youngest child turns 19 next week.

Attorney Laura Wasser, who filed Jolie Pitt's divorce on Monday, also represented Robyn Gibson and Shriver.

Couples can opt to pay arrangements without a private judge to handle their cases, although the same rules apply and a public divorce judgment will be filed at the end of it, Shulman said. The level of detail varies widely, with some judgments offering no details on how custody or assets are being split.

The judgment in Gwyneth Paltrow's divorce from Coldplay frontman Chris Martin, for instance, spans seven pages. Melanie Griffith and Antonio Banderas' divorce judgment, in which they split a variety of business interests but no custody issues, is 57 pages long.

All the lawyers interviewed said they hope Pitt and Jolie Pitt will avoid a public fight, and keep their divorce as private as possible.
