City Attorney Rush said the plat needed to be signed off by the City Surveyor-Engineer before anyone else could approve or authorize signatures.

<u>Commissioner Boukari moved that based upon the competent substantial evidence presented at</u> <u>this hearing, the presentation before the Commission, and Staff's recommendation, the City</u> <u>Commission find the application to be consistent with the City of Alachua Comprehensive Plan</u> <u>and in compliance with the Land Development Regulations, and approve the Final Plat of Lot</u> <u>18 of the Pilot Forest Subdivision; authorize the Mayor to sign the Final Plat acknowledging the</u> <u>Commission's approval; and authorize the City Attorney to sign the Final Plat approving their</u> <u>legal form and sufficiency once the Final Plat has been signed by the City Surveyor-Engineer;</u> <u>seconded by Commissioner Hardacre</u>.

She said the City worked with State agencies coordinating potential responses, brought on extra police officers, brought in utility billing staff to take power-outage and related storm calls off the APD communications officers, and generally just responded very well as a team. She said she was grateful the City did not suffer the damage of other areas, but she was really pleased with how well prepared the City was for a weather hit.

Commissioner Boukari said how pleased he was with City Staff's responses to both of the recent hurricanes that have threatened the area. He said he is grateful for the organization and the people.

Commissioner Hardacre said the Suwannee River Water Management District meeting is tomorrow in Live Oak. He said that the November meeting will be held in the City at City Hall.

Mayor Coerper said Alachua-High Springs Relay for Life is coming back to Alachua for the next five years. He said the kick-off will be November 1, and he is hopeful for a lot of participation from businesses and others in putting together relay teams.
