# 911 calls capture patrons' desperation

ORLANDO — Patrons trapped in an Orlando nightclub as a gunman carried out the worst mass shooting in modern U.S. history begged 911 operators to send help in audio recordings released Wednesday.

The 150 or so calls were the last batch of recordings made public by the city after a court fight with media companies, and they capture patrons desperately waiting for first responders to help them. Forty-nine people were killed and 53 others were seriously injured during the massacre.

"Please help us. It has been an hour," whispers a 23-year-old man trapped in a dressing room with three others at the Pulse nightclub.

The operators repeatedly tell the trapped patrons that help is on the way but that there are a lot of people to rescue in the club, as well as many hiding places.

Even though an off-duty officer was working at the Pulse nightclub and other officers responded within minutes, the standoff with gunman Omar Mateen lasted more than three hours. During that time, patrons told 911 operators that the conditions

of the wounded were getting worse.

"We have four people who are deceased. Two people are shot who are getting worse. Please come here," says a woman trapped in a bathroom almost three hours after the shooting began. "Everyone is getting worse. Where are they? Someone needs to come in here. I don't know what else I can do!"

When the man in the dressing room repeatedly tells the operator that the club has a back entrance officers should use, the operator asks him if he can get to it. The man says, "Yes, but I can't go.... I'm scared."

After almost an hour of talking to the 911 operator, he asks if the call is being recorded and then says, "I want my family to know that I love them."

The 911 operator tells him, "We are doing our best to get you to your family."

A short time later, the man says "Oh, my God" over again, and voices in the background can be heard saying, "Up, up, up, up, up." After several moments, and more than an hour and a half after the standoff started, the man says to the operator, "Sir, the cops got us out. Thank you so much. I appreciate everything."

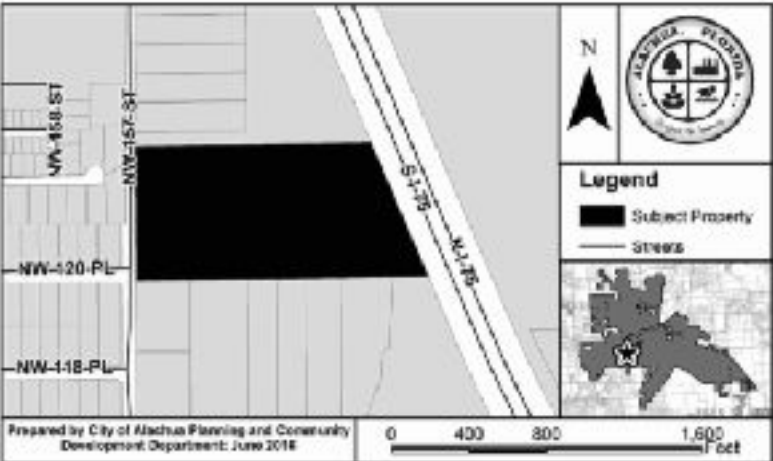

satisfying on a day-to-day basis, hour-to-hour, minute-to-minute, has been working on board the space station," Whitson told reporters over the summer.

"It doesn't matter if I'm cleaning the filters. I feel like I'm helping personally push forward exploration ... that's why I want to go again."

Strict when it comes to lifetime radiation exposure, NASA insisted Whitson remain Earth-bound for a while after her 2008 mission.

"I would have rather gone sooner, but I'll deal with it," she said.

Whitson was the first woman to serve as commander of the space station - in 2007, nine years into its lifetime. She also was the first - and so far only - woman to head NASA's male-dominated astronaut corps. No other woman has spent more time in space.

She'll ride a Soyuz rocket with a Russian cosmonaut, Oleg Novitskiy, 45, and a French newcomer to space, Thomas

Pesquet, who's 38. The launch is 3:20 p.m. EST Thursday, 2:20 a.m. Friday in Kazakhstan.

A French documentary crew followed Pesquet during training, focusing on his relative youth and fresh eyes. Whitson said the interest on her, by comparison, was for being "old and experienced."

"All right, yes, I'm old," she said in the NASA interview. She noted in a recent series of preflight interviews that it gets easier with age, knowing what to expect on a spaceflight and how to prioritize.

Her biochemist husband, Clarence Sams, also works for NASA.

Whitson already has spent 377 days in space and performed multiple spacewalks. Her upcoming six-month mission should push her beyond 534 days in space, the U.S. record set in September by 58-year-old astronaut Jeffrey Williams.

Whitson said she's had a lucky run with few regrets. But she noted: "In terms of goals for NASA before I die, we need to be living on Mars. And I might not live that long, so they better get with it!"

students who graduate with associate degrees, which are normally earned in two years from state colleges, a place in the university system, although not necessarily at the universities students want to attend. State colleges in the past were known as community colleges.

In the 2013-14 academic year, a little less than half, or 25,000, of the 55,000 students who earned associate degrees at the state colleges decided to attend state universities.

Some 27 percent of the associate-degree students graduate within two years of entering the universities, with 68 percent graduating within four years, according to the university system's Board of Governors.

Beard said the additional funding would be used to increase the number of academic advisers and tutors who can help keep students in school and on track for a state university.

"Our institutions are severely understaffed," Beard said.

As of October, a report from the Council of Presidents showed an average of one academic counselor for every 666 students in the college system, compared to a recommended ratio of one counselor for every 400 students.

The state colleges each averaged seven full-time on-campus tutors, with 51 part-time tutors. Twenty-three of the 28

colleges use online tutoring services to supplement the on-campus tutors, the report showed.

Other portions of the funding would help develop science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) programs that are limited or not available at state colleges or universities, Beard said. He said programs would include biology and ecology technology initiatives, cybersecurity and a "broad range" of health-care initiatives.

Beard said the colleges also need money to offset the costs of career and technical programs, which are being expanded at the colleges but are more expensive than general-education classes.

The state colleges are also anticipating a report from the Center for Economic Forecasting and Analysis at Florida State University that will outline high-need jobs in Florida. Beard said the funding would be used to add advisers to help guide students into degrees and programs that could lead to those jobs.

Beard also said the funding increase would be used to improve campus safety and security at the 28 schools.

The state colleges will be among a host of groups seeking funding in the 2017 Legislature, with state analysts already projecting lawmakers will have limited surplus funds for the upcoming state budget, which takes effect July 1. The 2017 session starts in March.
