new reservoir in Reed's honor.

"It saddens me so much to announce this good news at the same time of announcing the death of one of the nation's true environmental champions," Nelson said. "Nat and I have been so focused on advancing this new reservoir project south of Lake Okeechobee ... It would be a fitting tribute to name that project in Nat Reed's honor."

In 2017, the National Audubon Society awarded Reed its Dan W. Lufkin Prize for Environmental

Leadership "for his lifelong commitment to conservation and role in protecting America's Everglades."

"Nat was a giant in conservation — that phrase is used a lot but in Nat's case it's true. His scientific knowledge and his passion for birds and wild places made him a hero for decades and Audubon will miss him dearly," said David Yarnold, president and CEO of the National Audubon Society.

Audubon Florida Executive Director Julie Wraithmell called Reed "a giant of a conservationist, with his fingerprints on many of the most significant national conservation accomplishments of the last 60

years."

As assistant secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior for Fish, Wildlife and National Parks, a post he held until 1977, Reed is credited with the crafting and passage of the Endangered Species and Clean Water acts.

In Florida, he played a pivotal role in the late 1960s in the successful fight to block construction of a new jetport in the Big Cypress Swamp, successfully convincing Nixon to withdraw funding for the project.

Author and Miami Herald columnist Carl Hiaasen tweeted that "the Everglades has lost a great friend and champion. Nat Reed was literally a force

of nature."

Among his many achievements in the Sunshine State, Reed helped found both 1000 Friends of Florida and the Everglades Foundation.

"He was an avid fisherman and golfer with an unparalleled passion for restoring the Everglades," Everglades Foundation CEO Eric Eikenberg said in a press release Wednesday. "Personally, I've been privileged to know and work with Nathaniel over the last 16 years, and I am proud to have called him my friend. He was a master of words, bastion of principle, and a constant provider of sound counsel."

Reed also served on the

boards of the Atlantic Salmon Federation, Natural Resources Defense Council, National Geographic Society and Yellowstone National Park.

The Bob Graham Center at the University

of Florida noted on Twitter: "Mourning the loss of our friend, board member and inaugural Citizen of the Year Nathaniel Reed. Nat dedicated his life to public service and working to protect the environment."

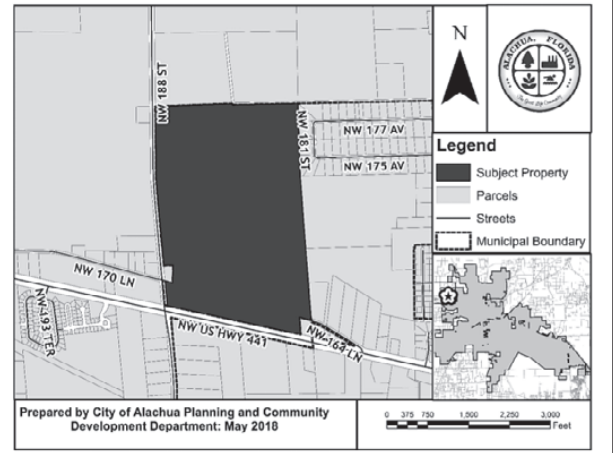

shrimp, crab and fish, and vegetables, such as lettuce, onions, beans, spinach and carrots.

Customers who want a Poke bowl, which are prepared by employees, pick out a protein, a base like rice or spring mix, choose from mix-ins like carrots, seaweed salad, scallions, corn, pickled radishes and tomato, and then pick a sauce.

Zheng said the crepes have been popular since J-Petal opened.

She said some people have had a big enough appetite for a Poke bowl and then a sweet crepe for dessert.

J-Petal is open Monday through Thursday from 11 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 11 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. and Sundays from noon to 9:30 p.m.

If It Is Thai restaurant now open on South Main

If It Is Kitchen and Cafe, a Thai and sushi restaurant in downtown Gainesville, is now open.

Manager Khetpapol Limphoka said the restaurant, located at 104 S. Main St., held its soft opening June 20 and is quickly gaining a following.

"We have people coming in like, three, maybe four days in a row because they want to try our food," Limphoka said. "It seems like they like it."

Limphoka said he and the restaurant's owners hope to offer the most authentic Thai food in Gainesville.

The owners even came

up with a restaurant name with three I's, each representing an owner. Its logo also looks like the Roman numeral three.

Limphoka said employees make its curries fresh every day and it has high-end fish, like bluefin tuna, shipped overnight from places like Seattle, Washington, and Japan.

He said the restaurant also offers a traditional Omakase service, where its sushi chefs make a single piece of sushi at a time, as guests request them.

Limphoka said the restaurant also infuses Thai-style flavors into its Japanese sushi rolls.

"We always want to present the best quality and the best foods," Limphoka said.

The restaurant's cafe offers specialty drinks, like bubble tea. And its full bar offers sake, Japanese beers and whiskeys.

The restaurant is open from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Sunday through Wednesday and 11 a.m. to midnight Thursday

through Saturday.

MOD Pizza to open in August at The Standard

A new pizza joint will open next month in Gainesville.

MOD Pizza, a fast-casual artisan pizzeria, will open Aug. 13 on the ground floor of The Standard apartment complex at 50 NW 13th St., Unit 30.

Brick Kerge, vice president of operations for MOD pizza in Florida, said the restaurant chain decided to come to Gainesville because of the college students in the area.

"Gainesville has a lot of college students and they like pizza, so based on that, we felt we could thrive there," he said.

Kerge said MOD builds pizzas in front of customers, who can choose from up to 30 toppings. The pizza is cooked in an 800-degree oven and is ready in minutes, he said.

MOD offers a build-your-own, 11-inch pizza at about \$7.50, depending

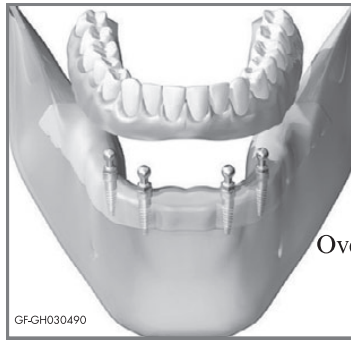
on the location, and does not charge for extra toppings, Kerge said, which is a crowd favorite.

The menu also includes handspun milkshakes, lemonades, iced teas, and local craft beers and wine.

The 3,100-square foot Gainesville store will be open Sunday through Thursday from 10:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. and from 10:30 a.m. to midnight on Friday and Saturday.

MOD Pizza was founded in Seattle and has four Florida locations, with two more on the way, according to Kerge.

BBX Capital, the exclusive franchisee for the MOD Pizza brand in Florida, has signed an agreement to add up to 60 MOD locations throughout the state over the next five to seven years.
