

# Sanders backs Gillum in governor's race

TALLAHASSEE — Throughout his bid for Florida governor, Tallahassee Mayor Andrew Gillum has tried to appeal to the progressive voters who rallied behind Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders' insurgent presidential campaign in 2016.

Sanders apparently liked what he saw.

With the Democratic gubernatorial primary less than four weeks away, Sanders on Wednesday endorsed Gillum, pointing to Gillum's stances on issues near and dear to left-leaning voters.

"As governor, Andrew Gillum will work to provide health care for all through a Medicare-for-All program, raise the minimum wage to a living wage, invest in sustainable energy, improve education, make sure the wealthiest corporations pay their fair share of taxes, and be welcoming to immigrants," Sanders said in a statement released by the Gillum campaign. "Andrew has never backed down from a fight, including beating the NRA and standing up against xenophobic politicians. Andrew Gillum will set a new course for Florida — a governor who represents all the people and not just powerful special interests."

The endorsement could give a late boost to Gillum, who has trailed his primary opponents in fundraising and in recent polls.

A Florida Atlantic

University poll released last week, for example, showed Gillum with support from 7 percent of Democratic voters, while a Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy poll showed him at 10 percent.

Both polls, however, also showed large numbers of undecided Democratic voters.

The Gillum campaign quickly tried to seize on the Sanders endorsement, which came a day before the Democratic candidates will hold their final televised debate before the Aug. 28 primary.

"It's an honor to have Senator Bernie Sanders' endorsement in this campaign," Gillum said in a statement. "He has been an unapologetic fighter for everyday working people standing up to the special interests. From Medicare-for-All, to a \$15 minimum wage, his ideas and platform have become the Democratic Party's north star on economic justice for those who need it most."

While it is too early to gauge the effect of the endorsement, the Republican primary for governor has been remade after President Donald Trump endorsed Northeast Florida Congressman Ron DeSantis. State Agriculture Commissioner Adam Putnam was the front-runner for months in the GOP race, but DeSantis has surged into the lead after the Trump endorsement — which was highlighted during a raucous Trump rally Tuesday night in Tampa.

# Trump's backing puts new twist on Florida governor's race

TALLAHASSEE — President Donald Trump's Florida rally couldn't have come at a better time for Republican U.S. Rep. Ron DeSantis, who may have locked up a primary victory as he seeks to become Florida's next governor.

Thousands of people attended the Tuesday rally in Tampa as thousands of absentee ballots are arriving in mailboxes across Florida. Just the fact that Trump endorsed DeSantis earlier in the campaign helped him surge past Agriculture Commissioner Adam Putnam in Republican primary polls. Now with headlines and photos of DeSantis and Trump together on nearly every major newspaper's front page and on television news around the state reinforces that support with a Republican base that loves the president.

"It would appear that Republican primary voters are willing to slavishly follow their master's every dictamen," said Tallahassee-based lobbyist and Republican political strategist Mac Stipanovich. "It's really odd, hard to describe and actually frightening."

Most political observers would have assumed Putnam was going to be the nominee when he entered the race 15 months

ago. He had seemingly been building up to this campaign his entire adult life. He was elected to the state House in 1996 as a 22-year-old and four years later to the U.S. House, where he served five terms and became one of the most powerful House Republicans. He left Washington and was elected agriculture commissioner in 2010. This year, he has widespread establishment support and has spent more than \$26 million between his campaign account and a political committee on the race. He's made countless stops around the state, running a traditional grassroots

campaign with a focus on Florida issues.

But seemingly overnight DeSantis has erased whatever advantage Putnam had with a campaign largely based on Fox News appearances, Trump's backing and a focus on national issues. DeSantis, a former Navy officer, cast himself as a Washington outsider when he won his seat in 2012 and his goal was originally to remain in Washington — not run for governor. He ran for U.S. Senate in 2016, but dropped out of the race when Republican Sen. Marco Rubio decided to run for re-election. DeSantis didn't enter

the governor's race until January and until recently held few in-state campaign events. Instead, he's appeared on Fox News more than 100 times, usually defending Trump.

That loyalty helped sway the endorsement. Trump called DeSantis a great friend and a "tough, brilliant cookie."

"I know him well. He's a great, great guy. He's going to be an incredible governor," said Trump, who is a part-time Palm Beach resident. "I don't do these endorsements easily. I don't need to be here, but I happen to love this state ... Though it seems to have an impact."

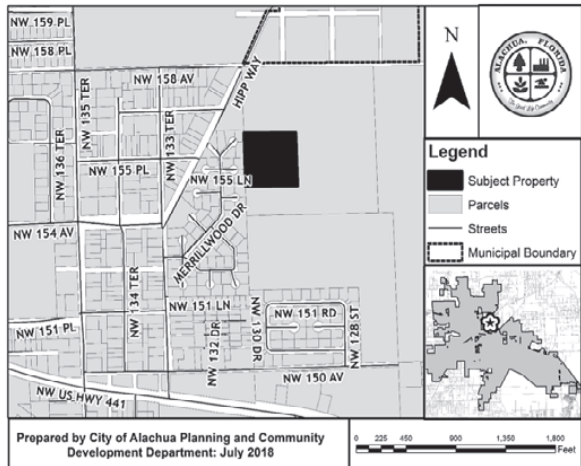
Trump then pointed out the recent Georgia Republican gubernatorial primary, where one-time presumptive front-runner Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle lost by 40 percentage points after Trump-endorsed Secretary of State Brian Kemp.

DeSantis's Trump strategy also appears to be working in Florida.

Terry Castro, a 71-year-old retiree from Tampa, says she likes Putnam, but is supporting DeSantis.

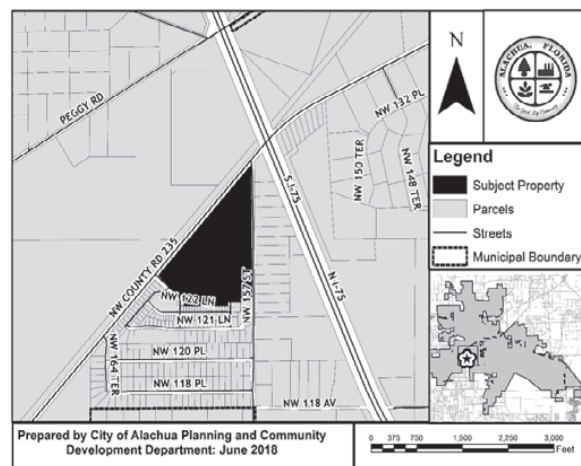

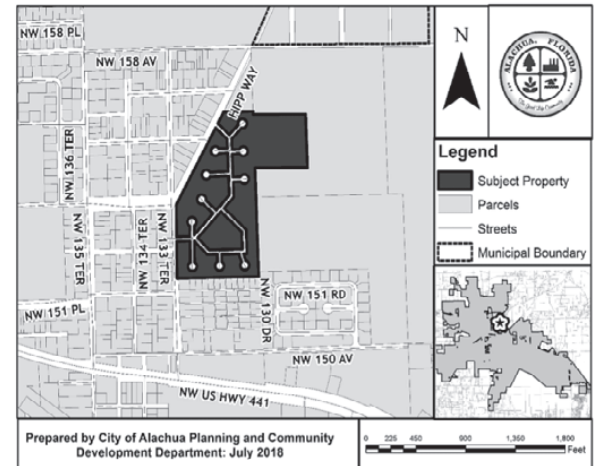

**WWTF will double capacity by 2020**

Mittauer's Vice President Tim Norman and Certified Building Contractor Greg Lang addressed commissioners to review the high points of an agreement between the two entities to begin the expansion process.

"The City's WWTF is currently rated for 240,000 gallons per day," said Lang. "The city is at 75-80 percent of capacity, which is the time to consider designing and implementing the expansion of the facility," he said. The expanded system will double capacity to 480,000 gallons per day at a cost of \$3 million.

Mittauer's agreement is broken up into two phases; the first of which is design & permitting. "The cost to complete that phase will be \$290,000," said Lang, "which would be offset by the Wastewater Impact Fees the City has been collecting." Lang added there is a "shelf-life" to these fees. "They must be spent or returned to the customer by seven years if they are not used by the City," he said.

The second phase of the project is the construction phase. "We have spoken with the Water Management District and they seem in favor of funding this type of project with springs funding," he said. The fact that the City is taking septic tanks offline and hooking them into the WWTF, in addition to the city's recent growth have made it a desirable project for them to fund.

Lang pointed out that there would be an additional \$270,000 is services due during construction. "This is a two-year process," he said. "It should be completed by 2020."

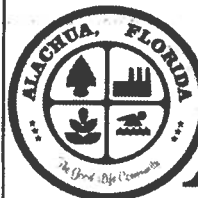
Following questions from commissioners, the Engineering Services Agreement with Mittauer & Associates was approved and signed by High Springs Mayor Scott Jamison.

"This is something I have been waiting for a long time," said Jamison. "I knew we were coming

to this point and wanted to get going with it as soon as everything was in place."
