

Here are the documents from the Environmental Protection Agency, noting the toxic chemicals left behind from several battery plant manufacturing operations- dating back to 1963' that have laid dormant on the Phoenix Park site.

Knowing the natural flowing creek system directly behind this site, flowing down thru the City of Alachua, ending at Hornsby Springs, will carry all these dormant toxic chemicals, is incredible.

Knowing that Virginia Hipp-Johns, owner of Phoenix Park - is the Chair of Suwannee River Water Management district, with a background in stormwater management & water quality, best management practices - also incredible.

I mentioned the connectivity between the creek behind Phoenix Park, with final destination in Hornsby Springs, which recently won State recognition. This State recognition requires ALL water traveling to this recreational site "enhance" the water quality, for the protection/health/safety of all those using this beautiful site.

The video I mentioned last night by the late Wes Skiles is attached & natural flowing creek system is validated by the red-dye trace study, also attached.

I am respectfully requesting a copy of the "leaps & bounds improvements on that site since July", that Ms. Johns spoke of at last nights planning & zoning meeting. I will be awaiting your FDEP portal of recent test results you referred to in our conversation.




