

The City of Alachua is considering applying to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity for a FFY 2018 Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application and if not funded a FFY 2019 Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application. The City is eligible to apply for up to \$700,000 in the neighborhood revitalization, commercial revitalization and housing rehabilitation categories and up to \$1.5 million in the economic development category. Construction activities funded through the CDBG Program must meet one of the following National Objectives:

Additional information regarding the range of activities that could be funded will be provided at the public hearing. In developing a CDBG application, the City of Alachua must plan to minimize displacement of persons as a result of the activities. In addition, the City of Alachua is required to develop a plan to assist displaced persons.

A public hearing to obtain citizen comment concerning the City's economic and community development needs will be held Monday, March 25, 2019, during a Regular City Commission meeting which will begin at 6:00 PM in the James A. Lewis Commission Chambers, City Hall, 15100 NW 142nd Terrace, Alachua, Florida.
