A. Ordinance 19-22, First Reading: Land Development Regulations (LDR) Text Amendments - Relating to

Certificates of Appropriateness; Amending, modifying, or creating the following Sections of the City of Alachua Land Development Regulations (LDRs): 2.2.1(B) and Table 2.1-1, relating to the development review structure; 2.1.3(C), relating to the powers and duties of the Planning & Zoning Board; 2.1.6(A) (2), relating to the powers and duties of the LDR Administrator; 2.4.6, relating to Certificates of Appropriateness; 3.7.2(A)(5)(a), relating to the requirement to obtain a Certificate of Appropriateness; and 10.2, definition of Certificate of Appropriateness (Legislative Hearing).

City Attorney Rush read Ordinance 19-22 by title only.

B. FFY 2016 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Neighborhood Revitalization DEO Grant #18DB-OM-03-11-02-N14 Modification #2
