

TODAY'S FIRE RISK





While the packages contain physical items that might be needed, ranging from clothing to food and reading material, the organization also strives to provide emotional support to troops who may not receive that family support. They become pen pals and respond with soldiers during their deployment, hoping of making the soldiers' tour more bearable. Once Lozano and the MSGAC connected, a new mission was born. Lozano would have patients or volunteers bring leftover candy in after Halloween to give to the MSGAC to ship overseas and help note further donations. This year, they shipped over 400 pounds to the troops. Although the candy was collected at Halloween, they wait until December to ship it, so that the troops will receive the extra treat with their Christmas packages.

This year, two more lists have joined the effort. Dr. Stephen Pavlik of Pavlik Orthodontics and Dr. Martin of Martin Kids Dental are both accepting donations at their offices well. Dr. Lozano is only accepting until this week both Martin and Pavlik's offices will be accepting candy through next week.

"Between the three offices, we expect to get over 1,000 pounds to send to our troops at Christmas," said Ronna Jackson of the MSGAC. The same deal applies at both locations of \$1 per pound, up to 5 pounds.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING POSTED NOTICE SIGNS


Pursuant to Section 2.2.9(D) of the City's Land Development Regulations, posted notice signs must be placed on the land that is the subject of the application, along each street which is adjacent to or runs through the land in a manner that makes them clearly visible. Signs shall be posted at intervals of not more than 400 feet when the land subject to the application has less than 1,500 feet of road frontage. When the land subject to the application has 1,500 feet or more of road frontage, signs shall be posted at intervals of not more than 1,320 feet.

Signs shall be inspected by the City subsequent to their posting. The applicant shall be responsible for ensuring that the posted notice is maintained on the land subject to the application until the completion of the final public hearing on the application.

Signs must be removed by the applicant and returned to the City within ten days after the final decision on the application.


